Lucent Technology Building Tour Lisle, Illinois

A new interpretation of the Crystal Place is the focus of this month's building tour. Join us August 8th for a view of Lucent Technology's latest corporate architecture. The firm of Kevin Roche, FAIA, has designed this translucent building with a view that is equally appealing from the inside or out. And what does this curtain wall reveal? A comprehensive detailing of structure, interiors that are integrated into the design by Roche and furnished accordingly by Steelcase, and state of the art M/E systems to control



the atmosphere and enhance this digital world.

The meeting will be at the east building in Lisle with a most interesting venue. Speakers representing designers and suppliers will be on hand to talk about the complexity of this design/build fast track project. Mr. Koz Sowlat from the Chicago structural firm of Thornton-Tomasetti will address the complex system used. Mr. Stan Zygowicz of RagnarBenson will talk about the unique method of erecting the "dish," the major structural element of the soaring atrium. Electrical and data distribution systems will be re-

viewed, including the structured cabling throughout the building that carries all telephone, fire, data, building automation, and security. Designed by AVAYA, a spin-off from Lucent, the cabling saved approximately 3% of the building cost. Most important, RagnarBenson will provide an overview of the project delivery method, an incredible feat of design and construction, coordinating the efforts of the entire team to design and build this \$125 million facility in two years.

Also on hand will be designers, contractors and suppliers to round out the presentation and answer any questions you may have regarding this truly unique building.

The evening will include building tours, presentations by those involved in the project, a video of



the erection of the compression ring structure forming the atrium roof, and an excellent meal. Meeting details will be available on the chapter's web site or by calling the chapter office at 630-527-8550.

I am proud to say we do have several chapter members who are making such influential contributions to shaping the environment by serving in some sort of civic capacity. I want to now mention and applaud the service of some of them here:

Karen McCarthy, AIA, has served for the last 3 ½ years on the Barrington Village Center Redevelopment Commission. She has been instrumental in masterplanning, hosting community charrettes, establishing Tax Increment Financing Districts and other tasks of the commission which was formed to prosper the redevelopment of downtown Barrington.

AIA Northeast Illinois Mission Statement

The mission of AIA Northeast Illinois is to provide member focus and activism, both community and chapter based, by enhancing and promoting the profession of architecture.

Karen feels that architects can make a big impact by educating the public about sensitive design saying, "Architects must make unified wholes of the communities." She also suggests that the AIA interact with the American Planning Association.

In addition to being a City of Aurora employee, **Dan Seggebruch, AIA**, has offered his civic service as a member of the Will County Historic Preservation Commission since 1999. His architectural expertise is an asset to rural areas of the county and he previously served on two other area commissions. Dan says, "public service is rewarding both for professional growth and interaction with the public."

Walter Hainfurther, AIA, is continuing the tradition of his parents and grandparents in civic and charitable service. He has served on the Highland Park Zoning Board of Appeals from 1989 to 1999 and now serves on the Plan Commission there. He feels that architects, by the nature of their training, bring unique perspectives to the planning process. He says, "As a member of a commission with attorneys, developers, financial experts, and general citizens, an architect has the ability to facilitate solutions that improve the quality of projects presented before them."

Mark Hopkins, AIA, is in his sixth year as a Plan Commissioner for Bartlett following five years of serving on the Economic Development Commission there. He points out that there are so many ways for architects to get involved including school, church, sport, and service club organizations. He states that "In every venture we represent our fellow architects. I would like to think that the presence of architects on

AAUW Offers Fellowships

Women graduate students in designated fields traditionally underrepresented by women can receive one-year fellowships from the American Association of University Women (AAUW) Educational Foundation.

Fellowships for the final year of full-time graduate study are available in architecture degree (M.Arch., M.S.) programs. Women in engineering master's programs are eligible for either the first or final year of study.

Applications for master's and first professional awards will be available August 1- December 20, 2002 for the July 1, 2003 – June 30, 2004 fellowship year. The engineering dissertation awards application is available August 1 – November 1, 2002 for the July 1, 2003 – June 30, 2004 fellowship year.

Judson College Department of Architecture

The excitement of creating and building a new architecture program continues. The program has just completed its fifth year of existence with 110 students enrolled. We have accepted our first class into the Master of Architecture program. Four students received the non-accredited Bachelor of Architectural Studies degree this past spring. 16 fifth year students are beginning their internship experience in offices that span from Elgin to as far away as Alaska. Third year students are returning from the second European tour. We have accepted over 40 students into the fall 2002 freshmen class. The "Community Service" class completed the spring post-term by documenting three churches for "Inspired Partnerships" in Chicago.

We are actively seeking two additional full-time faculty members to augment the current eight mem-

bers. Nine adjunct faculty members serve the program and an additional six to nine members will be hired. Faculty are involved in a variety of creative and scholarly efforts including work in the Chicago inner city, design competitions, seminars, sustainable architecture and historical research.

The National Architectural Accrediting Board has granted "candidacy" status to the program, meaning that on paper we are on track to achieve full accreditation. We must now demonstrate our commitment by actually doing and implementing the entire program. Full accreditation can be achieved after the first class graduates. Our first Master of Architecture class is scheduled to graduate in spring 2003. The critical full accrediting visit will then occur in the following spring 2004.

Gail Cabala, AIA, was elected in 2001 as a Brookfield Village Trustee after previously serving on the village's Plan Commission. She has the opportunity to set policy for the municipality making decisions on budgets, ordinances, zoning, planning, etc. She has been instrumental in the application and receipt of \$150,000 in grants to create a Comprehensive Master Plan. She also has brought forth improvements to the code department and raised the awareness of thoughtful zoning decisions. She "always has a mind toward applying principles that our profession advocates, including consideration of green space, historic structures, aesthetics and building in context with the surroundings."

Each of these individuals has been an ambassador for our profession and an asset to their communities through their civic service. I hope that all of our members will consider similar service some time within their careers. It can be personally fulfilling and the influence we could have over time would undoubtedly improve the built environment of the region significantly.

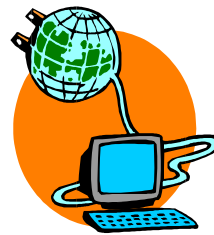

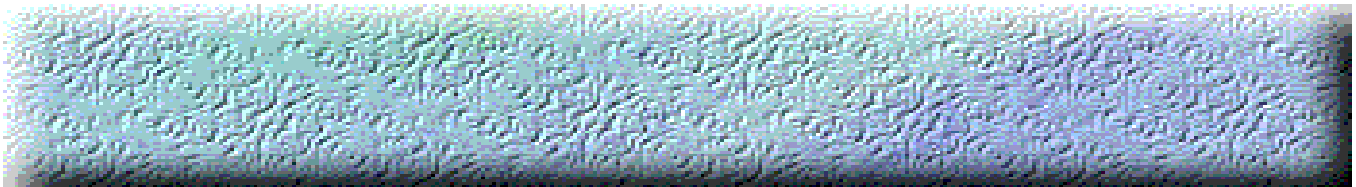
