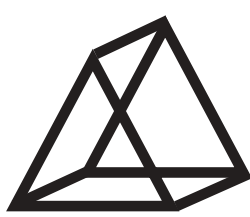

DOWNTOWNS IN THREE DIMENSIONS

Chapter Meeting, Thursday, March 20, 2003

The public and the market; the planner and the governmental process; the architect and the developer – how do these pieces fit together to revitalize a community? AIA Northeast Illinois Government Affairs Committee has invited Lee Brown of Teska Associates to present a program for architects and government officials that will examine how these pieces can work together to create better community planning. The meeting will be held Thursday evening, March 20th at Four Points Sheraton, 17 West 350- 22nd Street, Oakbrook Terrace.

The public recognizes the need to enhance and support central places in our communities. Whether at the scale of the Loop or the downtowns in our suburban and exurban communities, business district revitalization has become a critical element in both public discourse and decision-making. How does architecture fit in? This dinner chapter meeting will consider what it takes to encourage downtown revitalization, and offer a framework for how architects can contribute. The evening will begin with a brief overview of strategic planning, market assessment, operations planning, and implementation and retailer support services for business districts of mid-sized municipalities.

Lee M. Brown, our speaker for the evening's presentation, is the president and principal planner for Teska Associates, Inc. With more than twenty years of professional experience in planning, including seven in public service, Lee Brown has built a diverse background in urban planning, development review and real estate economics with a special emphasis on facilitating public/private partnerships for economic develop-

ment. As President of Teska Associates, Inc., Mr. Brown serves as project manager on a wide variety of projects which utilize his extensive experience in community planning and neighborhood and business district revitalization. Mr. Brown has prepared more than a dozen comprehensive plans for communities ranging in size from less than ten thousand to counties of more than 400,000. Teska Associates, Inc. has contributed to the redevelopment of a considerable number of communities in the Chicago metro area, including Aurora, Bartlett, Crystal Lake, Evanston, Geneva, LaGrange, Highland Park, Park Ridge, Wheaton, and Willow Springs, to name a few.

Don't forget to invite your local and county government officials to this program. Aldermen, mayors, building officials, city planners – just to name a few – will benefit from attending. It's a great opportunity to begin (or continue) a dialogue with these officials.

This will be my third trip in as many years and I expect to build on all of the wonderful experiences that I've had there in the past.
