Designing Sustainably as a Team: The Illinois Science Center at Argonne National Laboratory

Thursday, September 11, 2003

The NEI Committee on the Environment has invited Erik Olsen from OWP/P to speak on "Designing Sustainably as a Team: The Illinois Science Center at Argonne National Laboratory" on Thursday, September 11. The event will take place at the Embassy Suites Hotel, Lombard and will begin at 5:30 p.m. with registration and a social hour.

Working closely with the Argonne project managers, scientists and building operators, OWP/P, a Chicago-based, full-service architectural and engineering firm, utilized an integrated, multi-disciplinary



approach to design an energy-efficient building that is also a signature presence on the Argonne campus and features the highest quality laboratory and research amenities, auditorium, classrooms, and offices to help draw international researchers to study at Argonne. The 72,000 square foot building is an integral component of a much larger expansion at Argonne. Featuring a hybrid ventilation system, the design works with the climate, rather than against it, to create a healthier,

more stimulating environment for the building's occupants, whether they are the resident scientists or visiting scientists. The building itself will provide a living demonstration of concepts of sustainable design and promote scientific innovation.

Some of Argonne's primary concerns were equipment costs, ongoing maintenance costs, and, in particular, energy costs. Balancing the aggressive energy-conservation goals with stringent technology requirements was a challenge. The design team used sophisticated energy modeling and building simulation programs to provide alternate solutions encompassing everything from the building orientation and massing to the design of the building systems. The energy-saving hybrid ventilation system employs both mechanical ventilation/cooling and natural ventilation strategies. The design promotes both wind-driven and stack-effect air movement as part of the comprehensive design strategy to reduce the overall energy usage.

The building design, which uses a central atrium concept, creates a collegial, interactive, and dynamic environment, promotes good indoor air quality and occupant comfort, and integrates sustainable/intelligent building design elements, which include:

1. Lighting Control/Natural Daylighting
2. Solar Control Devices
3. Glazing
4. Thermal Mass
5. Hybrid Ventilation

Guidelines for Specifying Architecturally Exposed Structural Steel Available

A comprehensive guideline called Architecturally Exposed Structural Steel (AESS) is available for download on the American Institute of Steel Construction's website, www.aisc.org/aess.

The 16-page guideline helps designers communicate the desired appearance of AESS in a format that allows contractors to price/budget/bid more appropriately. It was compiled by the Steel Liaison Committee of the Structural Engineers Association of Colorado and the Rocky Mountain Steel Con-

struction Association, along with input from local architects and contractors.

The guideline addresses and further clarifies existing codes and standards, which do not fully cover the unique level of detail needed to successfully design, detail, fabricate and erect AESS. Failure to communicate this information can lead to improper budgeting for AESS projects, which may result in redesign, project delays and excessive project costs.

Rescheduling Fee for the ARE to be Implemented

A \$35 rescheduling fee will be implemented July 1, 2003. After July 1, 2003, any changes to scheduled appointments will be subject to the fee.

The fee will be assessed each time a candidate makes any changes to their previously scheduled appointments. Candidates will be required to select their future appointment date at the time they notify the Prometric Candidate Services Call Center of their schedule change. The only acceptable from

of payment of this fee will be by credit card.

If you need to reschedule an existing appointment, you must call the Prometric Candidate Services Call center at 800-479-6215 no later than 12:00 NOON Eastern Time of the third business day prior to your scheduled appointment. Saturday is considered a business day. If you fail to arrive for your scheduled appointment or try to reschedule without giving the required notice, you will forfeit the entire test fee.

Young Architect's Group Stanley Tigerman, FAIA, Presentation

The AIA/NEI Young Architect's Group held its third lecture at Archeworks in Chicago on 30 July 2003. The topic for the event was a lecture and discussion by Stanley Tigerman, FAIA. Mr. Tigerman discussed his 42 years practicing, Archeworks, and his philosophy toward architecture.

Founded in 1994 by designer Eva L. Maddox and architect Stanley Tigerman, Archeworks is an alternative post-disciplinary educational facility, capable of supporting up to 24 students. The students are broken up into three teams that spend the nine-month term working on a single project or "tract". The projects are engineered toward "design in the context of social cause". Students range in profession but share a common desire to work within "a design field that can positively impact social ailments."

The first project Mr. Tigerman spoke about was a "maze" installation done at Northwestern University to display small format artwork done by individuals detained in concentration camps in World War II. The space was organized to display a single picture on a single portion of wall. The walls themselves were organized and arranged to focus the attention of the viewers on a single piece of artwork. This provided an environment where the viewer could "commune" with each piece in a semi-private context. The design allowed the small format of the images, the largest of which is roughly the same size as a tabloid sheet of paper, seem all the more moving, and afforded the opportunity for the viewer to "get lost" in each image.

The Holocaust Memorial Foundation of Illinois (Skokie, Illinois) Building illustrates the challenge of literal vs. abstract in architectural interpretation. In 1977 the location of the largest population of

Holocaust survivors was Skokie, Illinois. Skokie was the site of many marches and demonstrations in the late 1970s, giving the site a special meaning. The building itself educates visitors by communicating many varied experiences of individuals rather than taking a more generalized approach. The architecture of the building reflects these sets of experiences as two distinct parts: as a descent into darkness in one wing, where the building is crudely detailed, dark and closed; and the ascent back into the light, where the structure is precisely detailed, light and open. Both wings are connected by a "book of remembrance" tower, which laces the building together both literally and metaphorically. The journey through the museum is one way; there is no retracing of steps, from entry to exit, start to finish.

Mr. Tigerman also shared his thoughts on architecture with the group through his experiences as an author, educator, and designer.

Designing Sustainably continued

The speaker, Erik Olsen, works as one of OWP/P's leading energy engineering specialists. In his time with the firm, he has worked on a wide range of building types for clients nationwide. He is one of the firm's most ardent advocates of choosing the appropriate modeling tool to evaluate a building throughout the design process. He has recently developed a presentation for the International Building Performance Simulation Association to promote this "right tool for the right job" theory of modeling.

His recent experience includes work with the City of Chicago Department of Environment, where he is playing a key role in developing a presentation that CDOE can present to other city departments, the building community and the public at large to understand the big picture benefits of the USGBC's LEED Green Building Rating system. 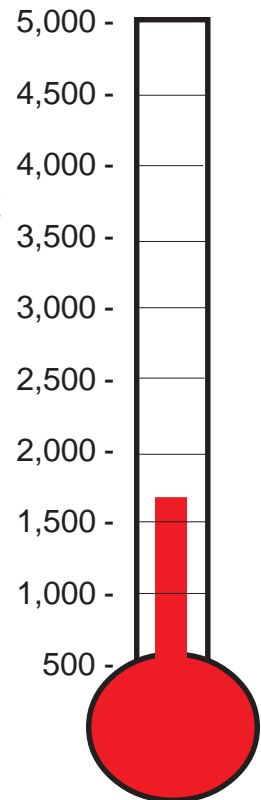
